## **Detail of change**

New text underlined, deletions struck-through:

- 1.5 The written work to be submitted should be a single essay on a subject relevant to the candidate's proposed thesis. For candidates in *Languages and Literature* the essay should not be more than 5,000 words in length; for candidates in *Ancient History* it The essay should be approximately 7,000 words in length. In *Languages and Literature* candidates will also be required to have attended such classes as the Graduate Studies Committee shall from time to time determine.
- 1.63. Confirmation of D.Phil. status
- <sup>1.7</sup>Candidates must submit the documents detailed in the Divisional regulations, above.
- <sup>1.8</sup>Candidates in *Ancient History* are required to submit a single essay of between 5,000 and 10,000 words in length, which should be close in content to a chapter or part of a chapter of the proposed thesis; candidates in Languages and Literature should be required to submit an essay, of approximately 5,000 words in length.
