Detail of change

1. Amend citation 1.14 as follows:

1.14(a) Offer a thesis of not more than 30,000 words, including footnotes and appendices. Two typewritten copies of the thesis must be delivered to the Examination Schools and addressed to the Chair of Examiners for the M.Phil. in Latin American Studies, c/o Examination Schools, High Street, Oxford, by 12 noon on the Monday of Week 5 of Trinity Term in the calendar year in which the examination is to be taken. An electronic copy of the thesis must be submitted via Weblearn by noon on the Monday of week 5 of Trinity Term in the second year of the course. Only the file submitted via Weblearn constitutes a valid submission; no concomitant hard-copy may be submitted. The submission must be anonymous, and the submission must be accompanied by a declaration indicating that it is the candidate's own work. Successful candidates will be required to deposit one copy of their thesis in the Bodleian Library, and will be required to sign a form stating whether they will permit their thesis to be consulted.

Explanatory Notes

Amendment to require electronic submission of theses. The change will apply to both

current MPhil Year 2 candidates submitting the thesis in 2019-20, and the current MPhil Year 1 candidates due to submit the thesis in 2020-21.
