Open applicants: candidates are given the opportunity of applying to Oxford without having to name three colleges. A total of 717 submitted completely open applications, while 1,880 named one college, and 2,273 named two colleges. The missing colleges were allocated by the Admissions Office computer which took into account the application patterns produced by the candidates who had named colleges. 131 of the 717 who submitted completely open applications gained places, which is an acceptance rate of 18.3 per cent. All but 2 of the 29 colleges were allocated open application candidates; 7 were allocated fewer than 10, 9 were allocated more than 20 with one receiving 124 allocated candidates and another 82.
