### Nomination of an external member of Council

Under regulation 9.3 of Congregation Regulations 2 of 2002, the nomination below shall be deemed to be approved unless not later than **4pm on 24 November** the Registrar has received from not fewer than 20 members of Congregation a written request for a postal ballot to be taken in respect of that nomination.

### Approval of the nomination of Nicholas Kroll as an external member of Council

The nomination by Council, under the provisions of section 4 (7)-(11) of Statute VI, of Nicholas Kroll as an external member of Council for 4 years from Hilary term 2023, is submitted for approval.

#### *Notes on the nominated external member of Council*

Nicholas Kroll, CB, has enjoyed a varied career in a number of senior roles in the public sector. He graduated in Classics (Corpus Christi), and began a career in the Civil Service as a graduate trainee. He later worked at HM Treasury, where he was Head of the Banking Policy Branch and Head of the European Community Budget Division. He was appointed to the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS), where he worked for 12 years in a number of senior roles including Head of Broadcasting Policy, Acting Permanent Secretary and Director of Corporate Services, and was responsible for leading on DCMS's spending reviews, and managing its strategic priorities and public appointments. In 2002 he became COO and Deputy Permanent Secretary, a role in which he was a senior member of the Department's Management Board and responsible for the Exchequer and National Lottery funds of £3.5 billion.

In 2005 he became Director of the BBC Trust, where he established new oversight structures and acted as

principal liaison between the governing body and the BBC's executive board and Whitehall.

Outside of his professional life Mr Kroll has been a board member of the Hellenic Society, the National Youth Orchestra and the Chelsea and Westminster Hospital Arts Project. He was made a Companion of the Order of the Bath in the 2002 New Year honours. He has been a member of Council since Hilary term 2019 and also chairs the Audit and Scrutiny Committee and serves on the Nominations Committee.

### Changes to Regulations

Council has made the following changes to regulations, to come into effect on **25 November**.

### Membership and remit of the Committee for the Language Centre

#### *Explanatory Note*

The following changes in regulation amend the membership and terms of reference of the Committee for the Language Centre following the Council Review of the Language Centre.

#### *Text of Regulations*

In Council Regulations 2 of 2004, concerning Other University Bodies, amend Part 3 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

3.1. There shall be a Committee for the Language Centre, consisting of:

- (1) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Education), or ~~his or her~~ their nominee, who shall chair the committee;
- ~~(2), (3) one person appointed by each of the Mathematical, Physical and Life Sciences, and Medical Sciences Boards;~~
- ~~(4) a person appointed by the Humanities Board, not being a member of the Faculty of Medieval and Modern Languages, the Faculty of Asian and Middle Eastern Studies~~

~~or the Faculty of Linguistics, Philology, and Phonetics;~~

~~(5) a person appointed by the Social Sciences Board, not being a member of the Department of Education;~~

~~(6) a person appointed by the Continuing Education Strategic Management Board;~~

~~(7) a person appointed by the Senior Tutors' Committee of the Conference of Colleges;~~

~~(8) a person appointed by the Board of the Faculty of Medieval and Modern Languages;~~

~~(9) a person appointed by the Board of the Faculty of Asian and Middle Eastern Studies;~~

~~(10) a person appointed by the Board of the Faculty of Linguistics, Philology, and Phonetics;~~

~~(11) a person appointed by the Board of the Department of Education;~~

~~(12) the Director of the Language Centre;~~

~~(13), (14) two student members appointed by the Oxford University Student Union, of whom one shall be a representative of graduate students and one a representative of undergraduate students.~~

(2), (3) two people appointed by the Humanities Board (one of whom being normally a member of the Faculty of Medieval and Modern Languages);

(4) a person appointed by the Mathematical, Physical and Life Sciences Board;

(5) a person appointed by the Medical Sciences Board;

(6), (7) two people appointed by the Social Sciences Board;

(8) a person appointed by the Continuing Education Strategic Management Board;

(9) a person appointed by the Conference of Colleges (being

normally a member of Senior Tutors' Committee or Graduate Committee);

(10) a person appointed by the Curators of the University Libraries;

(11), (12) two external members aligned with the centre's constituent parts appointed by Education Committee;

(13) the Director of the Language Centre;

(14) the Director of the Centre for Teaching and Learning or their nominee;

(15) a student member appointed by the Council of Oxford University Student Union.

3.2. The period of office for the members under regulations 3.1 (2) ~~(11)~~ (12) above shall be ~~four~~ three years, and that for the members under regulation 3.1 ~~(13)~~ and (14) ~~(15)~~ shall be one year.

3.3. Members appointed under regulation 3.1 (2) ~~(11)~~ (12) and 3.1 ~~(13)~~, ~~(14)~~ (15) above shall serve no more than two consecutive full terms of office. Casual terms of office shall not count towards this limit.

3.4. Notwithstanding regulation 3.3 above, the General Purposes Committee of Council may determine that one further consecutive period is permitted in an individual case.

3.5. The committee shall have power to co-opt up to three additional members, who shall hold office for periods to be fixed by the committee.

~~3.6. The duties of the committee shall be:~~

~~(1) to determine the policy of the centre, and to exercise general supervision over its work;~~

~~(2) to appoint the Director and Assistant Director of the centre, and to prescribe their duties and conditions of service, subject to the approval of Council;~~

~~(3) to submit a report annually to Council;~~

~~3.7. The Director shall, subject to report to the committee:~~

~~(1) appoint the supporting staff of the centre (other than the Assistant Director) and prescribe their duties and conditions of service subject to the provisions of any statute or regulation of general application;~~

~~(2) make provision for the lighting, warming, water supply, and cleaning of the premises allocated to the centre.~~

3.6 The committee shall, subject to plans, policies and guidelines set by Council and its committees, have the following functions and powers, together with such other functions and powers as may be assigned to it by Education Committee:

(1) The committee shall exercise oversight of and advise on the strategic direction of the Language Centre, including the development of a five-year strategic plan and mission statement for the centre which shall be presented for approval by the Education Committee of Council;

(2) The committee shall oversee and advise on the educational courses' portfolio offered by the Language Centre to ensure that provision is consistent with the five-year strategic plan and the University's expectations with regards to quality;

(3) The committee shall oversee applications for external accreditation of courses offered by the Language Centre and the compliance of the Language Centre with the requirements set out for external accreditation;

(4) The committee shall consider and advise the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee of Council through Education Committee on the funding requirements of the centre in accordance with the five-year strategic plan;

(5) The committee shall advise the University on the appointment to

the post of Director of the Language Centre;

and

(6) The committee shall make an annual report to the Education Committee of Council on the activities of the committee and of the Language Centre in the preceding academic year, which shall include measurement against the centre's agreed five-year strategic plan.
