General Purposes Committee

The General Purposes Committee of Council has made the following changes to regulations, to come into effect on **1 December**.

Alexander Mosley Professor of Biophysics Fund

(a) Explanatory Note

This change ensures that the authority of Council and Congregation to amend Trust Regulations is accurately reflected. The University is required to seek the approval of His Majesty in Council only where a change to the main object of a trust is proposed.

Text of Regulations

In Council Regulations 25 of 2002 concerning the Alexander Mosley Professor of Biophysics Fund, amend regulation 12 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

'12. Any amendment to regulation 3 is an amendment to the main objects of the Fund, as set out in regulation 3, for the purposes of Part D of Statute XVI and must be approved both by Congregation of the University and subsequently by His Majesty in Council.'

(b) Explanatory Note

These changes amend the name of the post in line with a request from the donor, amend certain outdated provisions and move the regulations into Council Regulations 24 of 2002 in line with standard practice for Trust Regulations which also govern appointment to a statutory post.

Text of Regulations

1 In the part of Council Regulations 25 of 2002 concerning the Alexander Mosley Professor of Biophysics Fund, regulation 1, delete 'Alexander Mosley', and retitle this part of the regulations accordingly.

2 Ibid, regulation 3, subject to the prior change to regulation 12 being in effect, delete 'Alexander Mosley'.

3 Ibid, amend regulation 5 (1) as follows (deleted text struckthrough)

'the Vice-Chancellor, or if the Master of St Peter's is the Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by Council on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an elector on that occasion;'.

4. Move the entirety of the aforementioned part of Council Regulations 25 of 2002 to Council Regulations 24 of 2002.

I have been an externally funded researcher most of my academic career, from initial postdoctoral positions onto moving to a Principal Investigator role with external medical charity funding from the Stroke Association in 2015 and 2019 and now holding a senior research fellowship funded by an NIHR advanced fellowship award.
