Council of the University

Council has made the following changes to regulations, to come into effect on **4 April**, unless notice of a resolution calling upon Council to annul or amend the

regulation is received by the Registrar by **noon on 31 March** (as set out in Statute VI: Council).

(a) Education Committee

Explanatory Note

The following change has been made to align the terminology relating to divisional planning process cycles in the Education Committee's terms of reference with the terminology in the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee's terms of reference. The change will remove the need to update the terms of reference again in the event of future changes to the length of the planning cycle.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Part 2 of Council Regulations 15 of 2002</u>, concerning the Education Committee, amend regulation 3 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

'3. The committee shall be responsible for the following matters, in liaison with the divisions, colleges, societies, and Permanent Private Halls as appropriate:

...

(8) in the light of all the above and on the basis of divisional three-yearmulti-year rolling plans, the consideration of the overall balance of activity and provision of resources between graduate studies, undergraduate studies, and continuing education respectively, and the making of recommendations to Council through its Planning and Resource Allocation Committee.'

(b) Environmental Sustainability Subcommittee of the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee

Explanatory Note

It is proposed to add the chairs of the Domestic and Estates Bursars Committees of Conference to the membership of the Environmental Sustainability Subcommittee, due to the benefits to be gained by the University and colleges working together closely in this important and fast-moving area.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Part 33 of Council Regulations 15 of 2002</u>, concerning the Environmental Sustainability Subcommittee, amend regulation 33.1 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

- '33.1. The Environmental Sustainability Subcommittee of the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee shall consist of:
 - (1) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Planning and Resources) who shall chair the subcommittee;
 - (2) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Education) (or nominee);
 - (3) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Research) (or nominee);
 - (4) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (People and Digital) (or nominee);
 - (5) the Chief Financial Officer (or nominee);
 - (6) the Director of Estates (or nominee);

- (7) one of the Proctors or the Assessor as may be agreed between them;
- (8)–(11) one representative of each of the academic divisions with relevant expertise, appointed by the head of each division, respectively;
- (12) a representative of Gardens, Libraries and Museums with relevant expertise, appointed by the Head of Gardens, Libraries and Museums;
- (13) a representative from the Department for Continuing Education with relevant expertise, appointed by the director of the department;
- (14) a representative of the Conference of Colleges, elected by the Conference of Colleges; and
- (15) the Chair of the Committee of Domestic Bursars (or nominee);
- (16) the Chair of the Committee of Estate Bursars (or nominee); and

(15)(17) one sabbatical trustee of the Oxford University Student Union.'

(c) Services Subcommittee of the Planning and Resource Allocation Subcommittee

Explanatory Note

The following changes are proposed to reflect the new responsibilities and accountabilities of the Services Subcommittee to oversee end-to-end professional services, resulting from the Strategic Review of Professional Services. The proposed membership changes reflect the removal of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Development and External Affairs from the membership as the position no longer exists. It is therefore proposed to increase the Heads of Service representation from one member to two.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Part 34 of Council Regulations 15 of 2002</u>, concerning the Services Subcommittee of the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee (PRAC), amend the regulations as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

- '34.1. The Services Subcommittee shall consist of:
 - (1) the Registrar, who shall be chair of the committee;
 - (2) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor Development and External Affairs, or their nominee;
 - (3)(2) the Chief Financial Officer, or their nominee;
 - (4)-(7)(3)-(6) the Divisional Registrars;
 - (8)(7) the Gardens, Libraries and Museums Registrar;
 - (9)-(12)(8)-(11) one person appointed by each of the divisional boards from amongst the departments and faculties;
 - (13)(12) the Director of Planning and Council Secretariat;
 - $\frac{(14)(13)}{\text{one two}}$ heads of service appointed by the Registrar;
 - (15)(14) one member of the Estates Bursars' Committee of Conference;
 - (16)(15) one external member of the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee to be appointed by that committee.
- 34.2. The committee will be a subcommittee of, and report to, the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee. It will:
 - (1) provide and facilitate liaison between UAS service heads and those in receipt of central services to ensure the consistent and effective delivery of those services provide strategic direction for the delivery

- of professional services across the institution, in line with the ambitions of Professional Services
 Together, liaising as appropriate with the Registrar's
 Senior Leadership Team which provides collective operational leadership for professional services across the University;
- (2) discuss how to enable the efficient and effective provision of services across all levels of the University, including commissioning and receiving periodic service reviews to improve service provision across the University and to ensure that services are based at the most appropriate level of the University, in line with the principles of subsidiarity and sustainabilityagree operating models for professional service functions across the University, in line with the principles for service design set out in the Strategic Review of Professional Services, and advise and make recommendations to PRAC about the resource implications of changes to operating models;
- (3) oversee and monitor the effectiveness and efficiency of the delivery of end-to-end professional services;
- (4) oversee the delivery of improved professional services outcomes, with a particular focus on ensuring the delivery of end-to-end benefits, including through:
- (a) the commissioning of periodic service reviews to improve service provision across the University and to ensure that services are based at the most appropriate level of the University, in line with the principles of subsidiarity and sustainability;
- (b) understanding and aligning the impact of strategic change initiatives impacting professional services, to ensure they deliver in accordance with the principles of the Strategic Review of Professional Services and the Professional Services Together ambition;
- (c) holding UAS Heads of Service to account for effective and efficient UAS services, and for delivering improved outcomes for end-to-end professional services through improved planning, change management and support for professionals across functions through the effective implementation of Shared Leadership Groups;
- (3)(5) co-ordinate budget planning for the services and consider resourcing requirements for particular services within the agreed planning settlement provide strategic direction for the prioritisation of resources across UAS;

(4)(6) propose annual budgets for the services <u>UAS</u> to the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee and monitor the performance in-year against those budgets;

(5)(7) make recommendations on the charging out of costs to colleges via the Integrated Charging Mechanism;

(6)(8) review business cases being submitted by UAS services for capital projects funded from the Strategic or Minor Capital Plans.

(9) provide strategic direction to the Administration
Portfolio Committee, ensuring that the proposed
pipeline of investment delivers against the priorities set
by the subcommittee, and provide advice and input to
other portfolio committees to ensure their investment is
informed by a clear understanding of the priorities and
direction set by the Services Subcommittee.

34.3. In respect of multi-year planning settlements, the subcommittee shall:

(a) consider the resourcing requirements for UAS services at all levels of the University throughout the next planning settlement period;

(b) make proposals to the Budget Planning Subcommittee for service charging to ensure adequate resourcing to meet central service provision requirements

34.4. For items concerning the agreement of the multiyear planning settlements, the external member shall chair the meeting.'

(d) Regulations for Committees Reporting Directly to Council or One of Its Main Committees

Explanatory Note

With effect from January 2025, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (People and Digital) became the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Digital). These changes to the membership of committees reflect that change.

(1) Voting on a Resolution authorising the allocation of space in the Stephen A Schwarzman Centre for the Humanities

Explanatory Note

The Stephen A Schwarzman Centre for the Humanities will provide approximately 14,200 sqm net usable area (NUA) upon completion, anticipated by the end of July 2025. This state-of-the-art facility, strategically located on the Radcliffe Observatory Quarter, will consolidate 7 Humanities faculties, the Humanities Divisional Office, the Oxford Internet Institute, the Institute for Ethics in AI, and several Bodleian libraries. The building will house improved research, teaching and cultural outreach spaces, significantly enhancing the quality and versatility of Humanities facilities within the University. In alignment with the Estate Strategy, the allocation will streamline divisional operations, optimise

space efficiency, and enable strategic repurposing of approximately 10,000 sqm NUA across other buildings

Text of Resolution

That approximately 10,883 sqm NUA within the Stephen A Schwarzman Centre for the Humanities be allocated to the Humanities Divisional Office, approximately 1,908 sqm NUA be allocated to the Bodleian Libraries, and approximately 870 sqm NUA be allocated to the Oxford Internet Institute, for non-time-limited occupation consistent with the strategic objectives of the University, each from 31 July 2025, or from practical completion of the building, if later.

(2) Voting on a Resolution authorising the allocation of space in the Life and Mind Building

Explanatory Note

The Life and Mind Sciences Building (LaMB) is a key development for the Mathematical, Physical and Life Sciences (MPLS) and Medical Sciences Divisions, addressing the longstanding need for consolidated facilities following the closure of the Tinbergen Building in 2017. Scheduled for completion by October

2025, LaMB will house the Department of Biology, the Department of Experimental Psychology and a portion of the Department of Biochemistry. This allocation is essential to supporting the expansion of key programmes, including the new Doctorate in Clinical Psychology and the INEOS Oxford Institute for Antimicrobial Research. By centralising these

departments, LaMB aims to enhance interdisciplinary collaboration, foster innovative research and improve the overall educational experience, aligning with the University's strategic objectives to attract and retain top talent and strengthen its impact on both the academic community and broader society.

Text of Resolution

That approximately 4,939 sqm net usable area within the Life and Mind Sciences Building be allocated to the Life and Mind Building Management Committee, approximately 7,937 sqm to the Department of Biology, and approximately 3,762 sqm to the Department of Experimental Psychology, effective from 3 October 2025 or upon completion of internal fit-out, whichever is later.

(3) Voting on a Resolution authorising the allocation of space in the Gibson Building

Explanatory Note

The Gibson Building currently accommodates the Faculty of Theology and Religion alongside part of the Humanities Divisional Office, occupying approximately 691 sqm net usable area. Due to increasing space demands and the expansion of taught MSc programmes within the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences, there is a need to reallocate this space following the relocation of the Faculty of Theology and Religion and the Humanities Divisional Office to the Stephen A Schwarzman Centre for the Humanities. Estates Services has confirmed no competing interests for the released space, and the Medical Sciences

Divisional Office supports the temporary allocation while the Oxford Institute for Digital Health project proceeds, which may involve the Gibson Building in the future.

Text of Resolution

That approximately 691 sqm net usable area within the Gibson Building be allocated to the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences for a period of 5 years, commencing upon the relocation of the Faculty of Theology and Religion and the Humanities Divisional Office to the Stephen A Schwarzman Centre for the Humanities.

(4) Voting on changes to the Conduct of Ceremonies in Congregation, and certain other Ceremonies

Explanatory Note

The following forms of Latin will be used at degree ceremonies and in certain other ceremonies. These changes are necessary so that the Latin used can refer to those who identify as non-binary, as well as those who identify as male and female. The Latin has been approved by the Public Orator. If approved, the changes will take effect from 1 October 2025.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Congregation Regulations 3 of 2002</u>, concerning the Conduct of Ceremonies in Congregation, and certain other Ceremonies, amend as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

Regulations for the Conduct of Ceremonies in Congregation, and certain other Ceremonies

Part 3: Degree Ceremonies

...

Order of ceremonies

3.14. One of the Proctors shall say to those supplicating for the Degrees of Doctor of Divinity, Doctor of Civil Law, Doctor of Medicine, Master of Surgery, or Master of Arts:

"Domini Doctores, Magistri (or Domini), vos Vos dabitis fidem ad observandum statuta, privilegia, consuetudines, et libertates istius Universitatis.

"Item quod quum admissi fueritis in domum Congregationis et in domum Convocationis, in iisdem bene et fideliter, ad honorem et profectum Universitatis, vos geretis. Et specialiter quod in negotiis quae ad gratias et gradus spectant non impedietis dignos, nec indignos promovebitis. "Item quod in electionibus habendis unum tantum semel et non amplius in singulis scrutiniis scribetis et nominabitis; et quod neminem nominabitis nisi quem habilem et idoneum certo sciveritis vel firmiter credideritis."

and the candidates shall reply: " $\!\!\!\!Dof$ idem."

3.27. When the granting of the grace has been declared, the presentation shall be made in the form:

"Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Baccalaureum (or Magistrum) in Artibus (or Baccalaureum or Doctorem in S. Theologia or Doctorem in Litteris or Doctorem in Scientia or Baccalaureum or Doctorem in Jure or Baccalaureum or Doctorem in Medicina or Magistrum in Chirurgia or Doctorem in Philosophia or Magistrum in Ingeniaria or in Scientiis Naturalibus) in Academia Cantabrigiensi (or Dubliniensi) creatum hic

<u>adstantem</u>, ut sit eodem gradu statu dignitate et privilegiis apud nos Oxonienses, quibus ornatus est<u>quae</u> <u>habet</u> apud suos Cantabrigienses (or Dublinienses)."

3.28. After presentation one of the Proctors shall say to each person who is being incorporated as a graduate above the Degree of Bachelor of Arts:

"Magister (or Domine or Domine Doctor), tu<u>Tu</u> dabis fidem ad observandum statuta privilegia consuetudines et libertates istius Universitatis"; and each shall make answer: "Do fidem."

3.29. Then the Vice-Chancellor shall admit each graduate in the form:

"Domine (or Magister or Domine Doctor), ego Ego admitto te ad eundem gradum statum dignitatem et privilegia hic apud nos Oxonienses, quibus ornatus esquae habes apud tuos Cantabrigienses (or Dublinienses)"; to which form, in the case of a

Bachelor of Arts or a Master of Engineering or a Master of Natural Sciences, he or she shall addshall be added: "Insuper [duodecim] termini, quos in Academia Cantabrigiensi (or Dubliniensi) complevisti, hic tibi secundum rationem nostram reputentur."

3.30. For an undergraduate the form of supplicating shall be:

"Supplicat A. B. e Collegio (or ex Aula or e Societate)
C., quicum olim in matriculam Universitatis
Cantabrigiensis (or Dubliniensis) relatus estreferretur,
ut bona vestra cum venia [tres] terminos in Universitate
praedicta per residentiam a se completos hic secundum
rationem Oxoniensem sibi reputatos habeat"; then, as
soon as the granting of the grace has been declared,
the Vice-Chancellor shall pronounce: "[Tres]
termini, quos A. B. in Universitate Cantabrigiensi (or
Dubliniensi) per residentiam complevit, hic ei secundum
rationem nostram reputentur."

Part 4: Forms of declaration, supplication, presentation and admission

Forms of declaration

4.1. The form of declaration under regulation 3.10 in Part 3 of these regulations shall be:

Propter formulam nuper a Registrario pronuntiatam, testimonium, in quo demonstratur scholarem supra memoratum (or scholarem supra memoratam), A. B. omnia ante excessum compleuisse, quae per Statuta requirerentur, ut ad gradum supra memoratum admitteretur, dabitur.

Forms of supplication

4.2. The forms of supplication under regulation 3.11 in Part 3 of these regulations shall be as follows.

(1) Degrees in person

Supplicant venerabili Congregationi Doctorum et Magistrorum regentium hi Studiosi (or hae Studiosae) qui compleverunt omnia quae per statuta requiruntur (nisi quatenus cum eis dispensatum fuerit);, ut haec sufficiant, quo admittantur ad gradum enumeratum.

Forms of presentation

4.3. The formulae for the presentation of candidates to the Vice-Chancellor under regulation 3.13 in Part 3 of these regulations shall be as follows.

(1) Bachelor of Arts

Insignissime Vice-Cancellarie, vosque egregii Procuratores, praesento vobis hunc meum scholarem (or hos meos scholares) in facultate Artium hic adstantem (or adstantes), ut admittatur (or admittantur) ad gradum Baccalaurei in Artibus.

(2) Master of Arts

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Baccalaureum (or hos Baccalaureos) in facultate Artium hic adstantem (or adstantes), ut admittatur (or admittantur) ad incipiendum in eadem facultate.

(3) Bachelor of Music

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc meum scholarem in facultate Musicae hic adstantem, ut admittatur ad gradum Baccalaurei in eadem facultate; ad quam admissionem eum aptum, habilem et idoneum esse, scholarem praesentem ob habilitatem et idoneitatem eiusdem sub chirographis hominum in arte musica peritissimorum abunde testatum testatam accepistis.

(4) Doctor of Music

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Baccalaureum in facultate Musicae hic adstantem, ut admittatur ad incipiendum in eadem facultate; ad quam admissionem, etc. (as above).

(5) Bachelor of Philosophy

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc meum scholarem (or hunc Baccalaureum or Magistrum) in facultate Artium hic adstantem, ut admittatur ad gradum Baccalaurei in Philosophia.

(6) Doctor of Philosophy

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc meum scholarem (or hunc Baccalaureum or Magistrum) in facultate Artium hic adstantem, ut admittatur ad gradum Doctoris in Philosophia.

(7) Doctor of Letters; Doctor of Science

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Magistrum in facultate Artium (or Baccalaureum in Litteris or Scientia) hic adstantem, ut admittatur ad gradum Doctoris in Litteris (or Scientia).

(8) Bachelor of Medicine

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Studiosum Studentem (or Studentes) in Medicina hic adstantem (or adstantes), ut admittatur (or admittantur) ad gradum Baccalaurei in eadem facultate.

(9) Master of Surgery

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Baccalaureum in Chirurgiae Chirurgia hic adstantem, ut admittatur ad incipiendum in eadem faultatefacultate.

(10) Doctor of Medicine

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc Baccalaureum in Medicina hic adstantem, ut admittaur admittatur ad incipiendum in eadem facultate.

(11) Bachelor of Civil Law

Insignissime, etc., praesento vobis hunc.
StudiosumStudentem (or Studentes) in Jure Civili hic adstantem (or adstantes), ut admittatur (or admittantur) ad gradum Baccalaurei in eadem facultate.

(12) Doctor of Civil Law

7.4. The new Vice-Chancellor shall then give the following undertaking, to be recited by the Senior Proctor:

(2) The Doctors and Masters shall then escort the new Vice-Chancellor to his or hertheir college or society (except when the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors determine otherwise at the request of the college or society concerned, or for other good cause).

The Committee on Honorary Degrees is seeking honorary degree nominations – nominations can be made by current members of staff and students via an online form: https://forms.office.com/e/u1kmkyKYmR.

When considering possible honorands, the Honorary Degrees Committee will focus on individuals:

- of high academic distinction in the fields of research and scholarship of specific interest to the University of Oxford;
- distinguished in the visual, literary, musical, and performing arts or in sports;
- · distinguished in business and industry;

- who have played a distinguished role in public life, for example in contributing to progress and change in society;
- who have made a significant contribution to the activities of the University of Oxford – such individuals would normally also fall into one of the categories above.

Within those categories, the Honorary Degrees Committee will aim to produce a balanced list, which takes account of the global dimension that characterises this University's activities.

When a degree is conferred upon a royal personage or upon the head of a foreign state it will be conferred by diploma.

The Honorary Degrees Committee has adopted a target that half of the final list of names proposed for the conferment of honorary degrees be women and/or from minoritised groups. Nominators are therefore encouraged to propose individuals of conspicuous distinction with particular reference to diversity.

Honorary degrees will not be conferred on anyone who holds, or who has retired from, a resident teaching, research or administrative post within the University or in any college or other society, except in exceptional circumstances such as distinguished service outside the terms of his or her paid service. In these circumstances, a proposal for an honorary MA may be put forward.

While informal soundings within the University will often be desirable, every effort should be made to ensure

that publicity is not at any stage given to any specific proposal for the conferral of an honorary degree. All nominations will be considered in strict confidence by the committee.
