Explanatory Note

These changes to regulations reflect new governance arrangements.

Text of Regulations

In [Council Regulations 25 of 2002](#), concerning trust regulations, amend the Tanner Fund as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

Council to annul or amend the regulation is received by the Registrar by **noon on 10 March** (as set out in [Statute VI: Council](#)).

‘4. The administration of the Fund, and the application of its income, shall be the responsibility of ~~a board of management comprised of three individuals: two appointed by the Sports Strategic Subcommittee; and one appointed by the Club with the approval of the Sports Strategic Subcommittee~~[the Sports Strategic Subcommittee of the Education Committee, which may appoint a board to manage the Fund on its behalf.](#)’
