The local restructure resulted in proposed changes to staffing levels, and four individuals were warned that they were at risk of redundancy, with individual consultation taking place. The union was consulted. Following this process, three individuals have been found redeployment or accepted voluntary redundancy during the three-month warning period. However, in the absence of agreement to redeployment or voluntary redundancy, the agreement of Congregation is sought under Part B, Section 13 of Statute XII to constitute a Redundancy Panel in respect of the remaining individual, in accordance with the regulations governing the membership of panels convened under Parts B, D and H of Statute XII. The role of the panel will be to scrutinise the proposal for redundancy, determine a recommendation on the case before it and report its recommendations to the relevant Divisional Board or equivalent. The member of staff whose post is under consideration is a Grade 7 education and outreach officer in GLAM.
