General Purposes Committee of Council

The General Purposes Committee of Council has made the following changes to regulations, to come into effect on **19 July**, unless notice of a resolution calling upon

(a) Regulations for the Kidani Fellows in Immuno-Oncology Fund

Explanatory Note

These new regulations are made to formalise the trust created by the receipt of the gift from the Kidani Memorial Trust.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Council Regulations 25 of 2002</u>, concerning Trusts, insert:

'Kidani Fellows in Immuno-Oncology Fund

1. The University receives with gratitude the sum of £3,000,000 from the Kidani Memorial Trust to be held as expendable endowment on the trusts declared in this regulation. Further money or property may be paid or transferred to the University as either expendable or permanent endowment to be held on the same trusts. The assets so held will be known as the Kidani Fellows in Immuno-Oncology Fund ("the Fund").

2. The University shall retain as permanent endowment those of the assets in the Fund (if any) which are contributed on the express understanding that they are to be treated as permanent endowment ("the Permanent Endowment").

3. The University shall (a) apply the income of the Permanent Endowment (if any); and (b) apply the income and, in its discretion, the capital of the remainder of the Fund, to support Fellowships in Immuno-Oncology, to be called the Kidani Fellows in Immuno-Oncology.

4. The Fund shall be used to pay the salary and expenses of the Fellows and associated overheads. If the salary, expenses and overheads of the Fellows are wholly or partly covered from other sources or there are further funds available, there shall be discretion to apply the Fund to support the Fellows' research or to support more Fellows.

5. The administration of the Fund, and the application of its income, shall be the responsibility of the Medical Sciences Divisional Board.

Council to annul or amend the regulation is received by the Registrar by **noon on 15 July** (as set out in <u>Statute VI:</u> <u>Council</u>).

6. The University may in its absolute discretion in the period ending 21 years from the date of this regulation, instead of applying the income of the Fund in any year, accumulate all or any part of such income by investing it, and holding it as part of the capital of the Fund. The University may apply the whole or any part of such accumulated income in any subsequent year as if it were income of the Fund arising in the then current year.

7. The University shall have power to pay out of the capital or the income of the Fund all costs of and incidental to the creation of the Fund and the management and administration of the Fund.

8. The University may exercise any of its corporate powers in the management and administration of the Fund in so far as those powers are not inconsistent with these regulations.

9. These regulations shall be deemed to be Trust Regulations under the provisions of Part D of Statute XVI.

10. Subject to regulation 11, Council may amend, repeal or add to these regulations in accordance with Part D of Statute XVI, but no amendment is valid if it would cause the Fund to:

(1) cease to be exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales; or

(2) be outside the objects of the University.

11. Any amendment to regulation 3 is an amendment to the main objects of the Fund for the purposes of Part D of Statute XVI and must be approved both by Congregation of the University and subsequently by His Majesty in Council.'

(b) Regulations for the Richard and Nicola Lerner Scholarship Fund

Explanatory Note

These new regulations are made to formalise the trust created by the receipt of the gift from Nicola Lerner.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Council Regulations 25 of 2002</u>, concerning Trusts, insert:

'Richard and Nicola Lerner Scholarship Fund

1. The University receives with gratitude gifts from Nicola Lerner to be held as expendable endowment on the trusts declared in this regulation. Further money or property may be paid or transferred to the University as either expendable or permanent endowment to be held on the same trusts. The assets so held will be known as the Richard and Nicola Lerner Scholarship Fund ("the Fund").

2. The University shall retain as permanent endowment those of the assets in the Fund (if any) which are contributed on the express understanding that they are to be treated as permanent endowment ("the Permanent Endowment").

3. The University shall (a) apply the income of the Permanent Endowment (if any); and (b) apply the income and, in its discretion, the capital of the remainder of the Fund, towards the creation and maintenance of scholarships in Biochemistry.

4. The administration of the Fund, and the application of its income, shall be the responsibility of the Medical Science Board, which shall appoint the Department of Biochemistry Strategy Group to manage the fund on its behalf.

5. The University may in its absolute discretion in the period ending 21 years from the date of this regulation,

instead of applying the income of the Fund in any year, accumulate all or any part of such income by investing it, and holding it as part of the capital of the Fund. The University may apply the whole or any part of such accumulated income in any subsequent year as if it were income of the Fund arising in the then current year.

6. The University shall have power to pay out of the capital or the income of the Fund all costs of and incidental to the creation of the Fund and the management and administration of the Fund and the Scholarships.

7. The University may exercise any of its corporate powers in the management and administration of the Fund in so far as those powers are not inconsistent with these regulations.

8. These Regulations shall be deemed to be Trust Regulations under the provisions of Part D of Statute XVI.

9. Subject to regulation 10, Council may amend, repeal or add to these regulations in accordance with Part D of Statute XVI, but no amendment is valid if it would cause the Fund to:

(1) cease to be exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales; or

(2) be outside the objects of the University.

10. Any amendment to regulation 3 is an amendment to the main objects of the Fund for the purposes of Part D of Statute XVI and must be approved both by Congregation of the University and subsequently by His Majesty in Council.'

(c) Regulations for the Rupert Murdoch Professor in Language and Communication

Explanatory Note

The following changes are to amend the title of the post in order to attract the widest range of candidates, include research in the duties of the professor, and update the membership of the electoral board. The change to the title has the full support of the donor.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Council Regulations 24 of 2002</u>, concerning Academic and Other Posts, amend the section governing the Rupert Murdoch Professorship of Language and Communication as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through): [•]Rupert MurdochProfessorship of Language and Communication<u>, endowed by News UK</u>

1. The University accepts with deep gratitude the moneys offered by News International plc for the provision of a Rupert Murdoch Pprofessorship of Llanguage and Ccommunication. The post shall be called the Professorship of Language and Communication, endowed by News UK.

2. The Rupert Murdoch Professor of Language and Communication, endowed by News UK shall <u>undertake</u> <u>research and teaching</u>lecture and give instruction in Language and Communication. 3. The professor shall be elected by an electoral board consisting of:

(1) the Vice-Chancellor, or, if the Provost of Worcester College is Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by-Council on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as anelector on that occasion;

(2) the Provost of Worcester College, or, if the Provost is unable or unwilling to act, a person appointed by the Governing Body of Worcester College on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an elector on that occasion;

(3) a person appointed by the Governing Body of Worcester College;

(d) Regulations for the Millsap–Humble American Football Fund

Explanatory Note

The following changes have been made to align with the agreement made between the donor, Ryan Millsap, and the University of Oxford.

Text of Regulations

In <u>Council Regulations 25 of 2002</u>, concerning the Millsap American Football Fund, amend the regulations, as appropriate (new text underlined, deleted text struck through): (4), (5) two persons appointed by Council, one of whom shall be appointed after consultation with News International plc;

(6) <u>the Head of the Humanities Division, or their</u> <u>nominee</u>a person appointed by the Humanities Board;

(7)–(9) three persons appointed by the Board of the Faculty of English Language and Literature.

4. The professor shall be subject to the General Provisions of the <u>regulations</u>decree concerning the duties of professors and to those Particular Provisions of the same <u>regulations</u>decree which are applicable to this chair.'

'Millsap-Humble American Football Fund

1. The University receives with gratitude funds to be held as expendable endowment on the trusts declared in this regulation. Further money or property may be paid or transferred to the University as either permanent or expendable endowment to be held on the same trusts. The assets so held will be known as the Millsap<u>Humble</u> American Football Fund (the "Fund").

2. The University shall retain as permanent endowment those of the assets in the Fund (if any) which are contributed on the express understanding that they are to be treated as permanent endowment (the "Permanent Endowment").

...'

Congregation 25 June

(1) Questions under Part 5 of Congregation Regulations 2 of 2002

Under the provisions of Part 5 of Congregation Regulations 2 of 2002, the reply, <u>first published</u> in *Gazette* No 5426, 20 June, p541, was read at the Congregation meeting on 25 June.

(2) Resolution in Respect of Statute XI and proposed amendments

As the meeting on 25 June was outside of full term, the regulations state that the proposed amendment should be treated as a request for adjournment and referred to the Proctors.

The Proctors have decided to grant the request for adjournment.

(3) Opposition to Resolution in Respect of the Reinstatement of the Graduate Application Fee

A debate on a resolution published in <u>Gazette No 5424</u>, <u>6 June 2024</u>, <u>p513</u> took place at the Congregation meeting on 25 June. The result of the vote taken was 142 votes in favour, 138 votes against. The resolution was therefore declared **carried**. However, since more than 50 members of Congregation have requisitioned a postal vote on the resolution, the carrying of the resolution in Congregation on 25 June is not confirmed.

(4) Voting on a Resolution to constitute a Redundancy Panel under Statute XII: Academic Staff and the Visitatorial Board

A debate on a resolution published in <u>Gazette No 5422</u>, <u>23 May 2024</u>, <u>p579</u> took place at the Congregation meeting on 25 June. The result of the vote taken was 130 votes in favour, 139 votes against. The resolution was therefore declared **rejected**. However, since more than 50 members of Congregation have requisitioned a postal vote on the resolution, the rejection of the resolution in Congregation on 25 June is not confirmed.

Postal vote

In the case of resolutions (3) and (4) above, a postal vote was requested by 50 members of Congregation by 4pm on 1 July. An electronic ballot on both resolutions will be arranged. In the meantime, neither resolution shall be deemed to be operative or to have been carried or rejected.

Degree by Diploma

The degree of Doctor of Civil Law by Diploma, approved by Resolution of Congregation on 28 May 2024, was conferred upon Her Majesty Empress Masako, Empress of Japan, at a private ceremony on 28 June.

The Public Orator made the following speech in presenting to the recipient of the Degree by Diploma:
