Voting on a Resolution to constitute a Redundancy Panel under Statute XII: Academic Staff and the Visitatorial Board

A debate and a vote on a resolution to constitute a Redundancy Panel took place at the Congregation meeting on 25 February.

Vote on the Resolution

The text of the resolution is: 'That a Redundancy Panel be constituted to consider whether to recommend dismissal by reason of redundancy in respect of one member of staff who is in a G6 professional services support role in UAS.' (See *Gazette* No 5444, 30 January 2025, p284)

The result of the vote at the meeting was 28 votes in favour, 16 votes against, meaning that the resolution was declared carried in the meeting.
