REQUEST FROM THE TASMANIAN ABORIGINAL CENTRE FOR THE RETURN OF FIVE ABORIGINAL TASMANIAN HAIR SAMPLES HELD IN THE COLLECTIONS OF THE PITT RIVERS MUSEUM

In accordance with the procedure for dealing with repatriation claims set out in the University's Human Remains Policy and Procedures for the return of Human Remains, the Visitors of the Pitt Rivers Museum has considered a claim from the Tasmanian Aboriginal Centre for the repatriation of five hair samples (1887.1.213, 1887.1.405, 1914.46.1, 1887.1.683, 2007.27.1) collected in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The Visitors are recommending that the Council agree to the return of the hair samples.

REQUEST FROM THE SARAWAK KENYAH BADENG ASSOCIATION FOR THE RETURN OF A SUNHAT LOOTED IN THE AFTERMATH OF THE PUNITIVE EXPEDITIONS OF 1895 AND 1896, AGAINST THE BADENG, HELD IN THE COLLECTIONS OF THE PITT RIVERS MUSEUM

If the number of nominations received by the closing date is no more than sufficient to fill the vacancies, the candidates nominated shall be deemed to be duly elected as of the close of the nomination period on **Thursday 1 February**. When required, places will be allocated according to academic standing, as defined in <u>Council Regulations 22 of 2002</u>, <u>Part 2: Academic Precedence and Standing</u>. If the number

of nominations received by the closing date is less than sufficient to fill the vacancies, those candidates nominated will be deemed elected unopposed, and the remaining vacancies will lapse, in which case, in accordance with the regulations, the places must remain vacant until appointments are made jointly by the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors.

Period of office

All vacancies are with immediate effect unless otherwise stated. In accordance with <u>Congregation Regulations 2 of 2002</u>, in any election where vacancies are to be filled for periods of different length, the elected candidates shall hold office so that the tenure of those who receive more votes shall be longer than that of those who receive fewer votes; but if the election is uncontested or if two candidates receive the same number of votes, the candidate senior in academic standing shall hold office for the longer period.
