# Approval of the nomination of Charles Harman as an external member of Council

The nomination by Council, under the provisions of section 4 (7)–(11) of Statute VI, of Charles Harman as an external member of Council for four years from Hilary term 2024, is submitted for approval.

## Notes on the nominated external member of Council

Charles Harman has over 30 years' experience in a variety of commercial and banking roles. He graduated in Philosophy, Politics and Economics (Magdalen, 1984) and joined Credit Suisse First Boston as a graduate recruit, where he was appointed as Managing Director in 1993. Following this he worked in other investment banking roles, particularly focusing on emerging markets. He joined Cazenove in 2001 as Managing Director, advising a range of FTSE 100 companies, and, following the acquisition of the firm by JP Morgan, was made Head of UK Investment Banking at JP Morgan. In 2011 he was appointed Chief Executive Officer of BXR Partners, an emerging markets investment group, where he was responsible for successfully realigning the

firm's investment business across several new sectors and geographical regions, including Africa and South America. In 2015 he returned to JP Morgan as Vice Chairman and has responsibility for some of the firm's largest clients from the UK and South Africa. Charles is also a business ambassador and Chair of the London Leadership Team of United Purpose, an international development charity, and Chair of Peters, Fraser & Dunlop, a UK-based literary agency and publisher. He has been a member of Council since Hilary term 2018 and also serves on the Finance Committee and the Committee to Review the Salaries of Senior University Officers and chairs the Nominations Committee.

# Approval of the nomination of Sir Chris Deverell as an external member of Council

The nomination by Council, under the provisions of section 4 (7)–(11) of Statute VI, of Sir Chris Deverell as an external member of Council for four years from Hilary term 2024, is submitted for approval.

#### Notes on the nominated external member of Council

Sir Chris Deverell has held leadership roles throughout his 40-year military career, which ended in September 2019. He was commissioned into the Second Royal Tank Regiment in 1979. After graduating in 1982 with a degree in Politics, Philosophy and Economics (Mansfield), he saw regimental service in Northern Ireland, Germany, Belize and Cyprus. He was appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire in the 1991 Birthday Honours, and went on to command of the Joint Chemical, Biological, Radiation and Nuclear Regiment. He commanded 4th Armoured Brigade in Iraq and Germany from January 2005. Appointed Knight Commander of the Order of the Bath (KCB) in the 2015 New Year Honours, he was promoted on 5 April 2016 to the rank of 4\* General, as one of the UK Chiefs of Staff. As the head of the Joint Forces Command he was accountable for around 25,000 people and an annual budget of over £5 billion. His responsibilities also included the delivery of military education through the Defence Academy. Having left the Army, he is now pursuing a portfolio career, having been contracted as a Venture

Partner to a US (west coast) venture capital company that invests in start-ups involved in cyber security. He will also be advisor to two other US companies: a start-up that provides software solutions in defence and security, and a scale-up that provides near-real-time alerting in multiple sectors. He has been a board member at a senior level in the public sector over the last ten years, involved in major financial and operational decisions affecting the foreign, defence and security policies of the nation, and the lives and well-being of many thousands of people.

He has been a member of Council since Hilary term 2020 and also serves on the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee.

# Approval of the nomination of Wendy Becker as an external member of Council

The nomination by Council, under the provisions of section 4 (7)–(11) of Statute VI, of Wendy Becker as an external member of Council for four years from Michaelmas term 2024, is submitted for approval.

## Notes on the nominated external member of Council

As a Chair, senior board member and advisor, Wendy Becker works globally with management teams and organisations, helping relationships between consumers and technology. She has vast experience in strategy, brand marketing, technology and design from her senior leadership roles, as well as diverse board and trustee leadership positions. Wendy is Chair of Logitech International SA. She also serves on the boards of Sony Corporation, Great Portland Estates, Oxford University Press and Saïd Business School, providing advice and sharing her expertise across a range of board committees. She was previously on the Whitbread and Ocado boards and held the role of Deputy Chairman at Cancer Research UK. Wendy previously served as CEO at Jack Wills (the clothing manufacturer and retailer) being promoted from COO after turning around the firm's historic operational difficulties and opening new growth avenues. She previously worked in the telecoms industry with Vodafone, sitting on the Global Executive Committee

as Global CMO, and with TalkTalk as Managing Director. In 1993 Wendy joined McKinsey and Company, becoming a Partner in 1998 and working out of both San Francisco and London for 15 years. At McKinsey she led the UK Consumer & Retail Practice and advised many global clients on embracing the digital world in their corporate strategies. Wendy started her career in brand management at Procter & Gamble after gaining a BA in Economics from Dartmouth College. She also holds an MBA from Stanford University's Graduate School of Business. Wendy has been named by the FT as one of the 'Top 50 Women to Watch in International Business' and has been a finalist in the Sunday Times NED of the year awards.

She has been a member of Council since Michaelmas term 2020 and chairs the Committee to Review Donations and Research Funding.

I was Director of Undergraduate admissions at EP (2016–2022), and in that position served on the EP departmental Teaching Policy Committee and ADCOM over those 6 years. I moved from Experimental Psychology to NDCN in 2022, thereby now having experience in two of the departments within MSD. Whilst the MSD board rightly has representation from some of the most senior members of the division, I believe I could add valuable new perspectives as a relatively early stage Principal Investigator.

The research reputation of our division and university depends in large part on externally funded researchers, who seem to experience both the best and worst parts of being in academia: the intellectual freedom to focus on truly valuable and important medical research with the insecurity of short term contracts and fixed term positions. It is key that the voices of externally funded research staff are represented at all levels of governance in the university, and I would be honoured to be that voice on the Medical Sciences Divisional hoard
