**Details of Change:**

Amend citation 1.21 as follows:

<sup>1.18</sup>10. *Core Subjects*

<sup>1.19</sup>(i) JURISPRUDENCE

<sup>1.20</sup>Candidates offering Jurisprudence will be examined in that subject by:

<sup>1.21</sup>(a) a two hour ~~closed book~~ examination at the end of a student's final year of the Final Honours School, in which students answer two questions from a selection of ten, and

<sup>1.22</sup>(b) a single essay of 3,000-4,000 words to be written during the summer vacation

between the end of Year 2 and commencement of Year 3 of the Final Honour School. Essay questions will be published by the Board of Examiners at noon on the Friday of the seventh week of the Trinity Term preceding the examination. The essay must be submitted electronically, by noon on the Friday of the week before noughth week preceding the beginning of the Michaelmas Full Term immediately following. On submitting the essay, candidates will also be required to submit an online declaration of authorship. Candidates will be contacted with details of how to access questions, and submit the essays. The essays must bear the candidate's examination number, but not his or her name or the name of his or her college.
