Amend citation references 1.122-123 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

^{1.120}*Note 1:* Each of subjects 503, 504 and 507 will be examined by a one-and-a-half hour translation paper on the prescribed texts and an extended essay of up to 6,000 words. Each of these subjects is available in three versions:

^{1.121}(*a*) Greek and Latin, for Course I candidates.

^{1.122}(*b*) Greek only, for Course II candidates or single-language candidates in Classics & English, Classics & Modern Languages, or Classics & Oriental Studies offering Greek for candidates who sat Course IIB in Honour Moderations in Classics, or who offered Greek as their only Classical language in the Preliminary Examination in Classics & English or Modern Languages.

^{1.123}(c) Latin only, for Course II candidates or single-language candidates in Classics & English, Classics & Modern Languages, or Classics & Oriental Studies offering Latin <u>for</u>

<u>candidates who sat Course IIA in Honour Moderations in Classics, or who offered Latin</u> <u>as their only Classical language in the Preliminary Examination in Classics & English or</u> <u>Modern Languages.</u>

Explanatory Notes

The existing wording of the rules on taking the single-language versions of papers 503 Historiography, 504 Lyric Poetry and 507 Comedy is ambiguous and is therefore being revised for greater clarity.
