Detail of change

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^{1.1}1. The subject of the Preliminary Examination in Music shall be the study of the history, criticism, theory, composition, performance, and practice of music.

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- 1.2 Each candidate will be required to <u>take</u> <u>offer</u> papers 1-4 and two of the options in paper 5. <u>Information on practical requirements for coursework submissions, including deadlines, is provided in the course handbook and on the course VLE.</u>
- ^{1.3}1. Foundations in the Study of Music (in-person written exam)

- ^{1.4}2. Stylistic Composition, Arranging, and Transcription (coursework submission)
- ^{1.5}3. Musical Analysis and Critical Listening
 - ^{1.6}The paper shall consist of two parts:
 - ^{1.7}a) Musical Analysis (online written exam)
 - ^{1.8}b) Critical Listening (coursework submission)

- ^{1.26}Candidates who fail one, two or three of papers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 above may resit only that paper or papers at a subsequent examination; candidates who fail four, five or six papers will be required to resit all six papers at a subsequent examination.

Explanatory Notes

Major Change approved by Education Committee.

The new Prelims curriculum was first introduced in 2021-22, with SCART being a prominent, mandatory, element of it. After three years of teaching the curriculum, the Faculty reviewed its delivery and concluded that it was creating noticeable workload issues for students, and for staff. Change in staffing presented the Faculty with the opportunity to rearrange teaching of the Prelims curriculum going forward.
