<sup>1.6</sup>3. Confirmation of D.Phil. status

<sup>1.7</sup>Candidates must submit the documents detailed in the Divisional regulations, above.

<sup>1.8</sup>Candidates are required to submit a single essay of between 5,000 and 10,000 words in length, which should be close in content to a chapter or part of a chapter of the proposed thesis fully worked chapter or section of a chapter of the thesis, of approximately 10,000 words in length.

<sup>1.9</sup>In Languages and Literature candidates will also be required to provide evidence of reading competence in German and a second modern language by the time of confirmation. Further details on the modern language policy are set out in the Faculty's D.Phil handbook.

# **Explanatory Notes**

At the GSC meeting of Michaelmas 2018, the Faculty agreed that Confirmation of Status submitted written work should be around 10,000 word; this has been practice since, but the regulations were not amended accordingly at the time. This information has been made available to students in course handbooks from 2019-20
